Directions

for voting rights and enrolment in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections in Denmark for citizens of another EU Member State registered with the protocol of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (EU-diplomats etc.)

1. Conditions for the right to vote

EU citizens who are registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and who have reached 18 years of age on election day are entitled to vote at European Parliamentary elections in Denmark.

The following persons are concerned:

- a) Diplomats and other service staffs holding an official duty-passport, who are living in Denmark and posted at embassies in Denmark, as well as accompanying family members and domestic servants belonging to the household.
- b) Civil servants posted at international organizations (inter alia EU institutions) in Denmark as well as accompanying family members belonging to the household.

As an alternative to registration with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, from 1 April 2017, the persons in group b) can choose to apply for an EU residence document at the State Administration (From 1 April 2019 the Danish Agency for International Recruitment and Integration (SIRI)) in order to subsequently obtain residential registration in the Central Population Register (CPR).

Citizens of other EU Member States with residential registration in CPR who will have reached 18 years of age on election day receives an individual notification via Digital Post (www.borger.dk) describing the procedure for enrolment in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections in Denmark on the basis of residential registration. Subject to a few exceptions, the municipality must have the application for enrolment no later than Tuesday, 23 April 2019.

It should be noted that persons in the abovementioned group b) who are already registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs but wish to obtain a residential registration in the CPR cannot be enrolled in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections on the basis of residential registration in the time between deregistration from the protocol of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and residential registration in the CPR. This change of status will take place according to a procedure set out by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Citizens of other EU Member States without residential registration in the CPR who are not (or no longer) registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs can apply for enrolment in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections at the municipality in which they have their legal residence. Subject to a few exceptions, the municipality must have the application for enrolment on the basis of legal residence no later than Tuesday, 23 April 2019. The relevant application form can be obtained at the municipality.

2. Participation in the elections requires enrolment in the electoral register

In order to exercise your voting right (the right to cast your vote in the elections) you must first be enrolled in the electoral register.

EU-diplomats and other citizens from other EU Member States who are registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, are not registered in the CPR and cannot be enrolled in the electoral register

through the procedure for citizens of other EU Member States who are registered in the CPR.

If you wish to cast your vote for the European Parliamentary elections in Denmark as an EU citizen registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, you must therefore fill in the answers to the questions re. your identity and private address etc. on the application form and obtain an attestation from the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your registration with the Protocol Department. The attestation must be made in the space assigned for the attestation on the application form. After obtaining the attestation you must file your application with the municipality where you have your private address. Remember to sign and date the application form.

The application can either be filed in person or by mail, fax or e-mail.

3. Last day for application

In order for you to be able to vote at the European Parliamentary election on 26 May 2019, the municipality must receive your application no later than **Wednesday, 1 May 2019**.

If you have not been registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs until **Wednesday, 24 April 2019** up to and including **Friday 10 May 2019**, you will still be able to apply to be entered in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections on 26 May 2019. The application must then be received by the municipality where you have your private address at **12:00 (noon) Friday 10 May 2019** at the latest.

4. Consideration of the application

The application is considered and decided by the municipality where you have your private address.

If the information provided in the application is insufficient, the municipality will notify you accordingly and ask you for additional information.

The municipality notifies the Ministry of Economic Affairs and the Interior in writing of which persons have been enrolled in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections according to the said procedure. The Ministry of Economic Affairs and the Interior informs the relevant authority in the relevant home country about which persons have been enrolled in the electoral register for the European Parliamentary elections in Denmark according to the procedure.

5. Consequence of the application being granted

If your application for enrolment in the electoral register is granted, you will continue to be enrolled in the electoral register for as long as you are registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Therefore, you will automatically, that is without the need for reapplication, be enrolled in the electoral register for the next European Parliamentary election. It is provided that you have not in the meantime moved abroad or to the Faroe Islands or Greenland or have requested to be disenrolled from the electoral register, see below.

If you wish to be enrolled in the electoral register for elections in Denmark for the local and regional government

elections you have to file a separate application. The application form will be available at the municipality or at the homepage valg.oim.dk. The application can be submitted from 1 August on the year of the election at the earliest (next election year is 2021).

6. Moving to a new address in the municipality or to a new municipality

Foreign EU citizens who are either registered with the Protocol Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, or whose stay in Denmark is regulated by agreements on the legal status of forces or military headquarters that Denmark has endorsed are not registered in the CPR as haven taken residence in Denmark. The municipality where you have your private address will therefore not automatically be informed if you move to another address in the same municipality or move to another municipality in Denmark.

You should therefore inform the municipality if you move to a new address in the same municipality. If you move to an address in another municipality in Denmark and wish to retain your right to vote for European Parliamentary elections in Denmark without having to renew your application,

you must inform the new municipality that you have moved and inform the municipality of your private address. You must also be able to document that you have previously been entered in the electoral role of the municipality where you had your previous private address.

7. If you leave the country

If you move out of the country you must inform the municipality where you have been enrolled upon request in the electoral register for European Parliamentary elections in Denmark that you are leaving the country, so you can be removed from the electoral register. Your move out of the country should be reported to the municipality from four weeks before up to and including the day of your move at the latest.

8. Disenrolment from the electoral register

You may disenrol from the electoral register at any time by filing a request with the municipality where you have your private address. In order to have effect for the European Parliamentary elections in 2019 you must apply for disenrollment no later than 10 May 2019.
